I absolutely love being here and have very much enjoyed getting to know the wonderful people who live in this community. I would like to encourage phone calls and appointments if you have a concern you feel I may be of assistance.

If you're unsure what it may look like to meet with me, I would like to offer you some detail. I can meet with you privately in your home, or you may come to my office. My office is directly off SM2 community room. It is completely up to you and whatever you are most comfortable is fine with me. If you have not completed initial paperwork with me, we will have some forms to fill out with basic information as well as confidentiality forms. Confidentiality is very important and I cannot disclose anything we talk about to anyone without your written consent. I can provide assistance with DHS, finding a chore provider, food assistance through commodities, food banks or food stamps, will and advance directive preparation and many other concerns. Please keep in mind that I cannot provide transportation, perform services myself or run errands for residents.

Feel free to call my office at 517-788-5519 to set up an appointment if you feel there is something I can do to make your life easier.

# **Spring Meadows Virtual Victory Cup**

Spring Meadows has won the Victory Cup 3 years in a row! This will be no exception!

Mark Your Calendars! June 17 & 18 June 17 @ SMII June 18@ SMI Start time 11:00 AM

Events: **Paper Airplane Distance Contest** –homemade paper airplanes (lots of ideas on-line) made from  $8.5 \, \mathrm{x}$  11'' paper. From a seated or standing position, participants will have 3 opportunities to fly/throw a paper airplane they will make no more than 15 minutes prior to the start of the contest. Paper is the only item that can be used (no glue or saliva). They can only write their first and last name and the name of the village on the airplane. Airplanes must have visible and recognizable wings, crumpled or wadded up piece of paper does not constitute an airplane. Age group: 55-64, 65-74, 75-84, 85 and up, 12 total entrants per village.

#### Beanbag Toss: 1 team of 5 participants per Village

From a standing or seated position 10 feet awayfrom the target, each team will attempt to score asmany points as they can during 3 rounds of tossing. The participants will toss "one" bean bag at a time, the next person will toss one bean bag until all 5 have thrown, then it starts again for 2 more times. Scoring – in the hole =5 points, on the box but not in the hole (it must be on the box 100%) = 2

#### Hoop Shoot: 12 total entrants per Village

Age group: 55-64, 65-74, 75-84, 85 and up.

From a seated position 6 feet away from a 5' tall basketball hoop, participants will attempt to make as many baskets as possible within a 30 second time period.

#### Wellness Walk: 12 total entrants per Village

Age Groups: 55-64,65-74, 75-84, 85+

Participants will walk 200 yards as fast and as safe as possible. Each participants walk will be timed and their time recorded by an official timer. The fastest 3 times in each age group will be counted.

#### The Puzzler

#### 55 & up

One team of up to 5 participants, Each team will be provide with an identical 100 piece puzzle. They cannot see the puzzle prior to the competition.

#### **Expression of Wellness: Essay Contest**

The theme of this year's Expression of Wellness is "Get Your Motor Running. Entrants must write at least one paragraph but no more than one page, typed. The topic is you and your first car (if you have a photo of you and your first car or a photo of you or someone close to you working in an automotive plant).

Questions to be Addressed: What was your first car; how did you get it; and why was it important to you? What is your favorite care? Please tell a story about it. Did you work at one of the auto factories? If you did, please tell a story you would like to share about something that happened or how the job impacted your life. What about a favorite memory or moment from an auto show?

**Spirit Award:** Show your spirit! Cheers! Poems! Get together and give it your best shot!

A Victory Cup Meeting will be held on June  $3^{rd}$  – 11:00 AM at Spring Meadows II and Spring Meadows I at 1:00 PM. We will explain the rules and regulations and have all of the release forms ready to go.

# For Your Safety.

### **Corporate Compliance**

Presbyterian Villages of Michigan strives to adhere to the highest ethical standards and practices. Every employee signs a Code of Conduct which states clearly, and without ambiguity, what our expectations are for each employee. Volunteers, including board members, are also held to those standards. Presbyterian Villages also requires that each board member and staff person in a position of authority, complete a "Conflict of Interest" statement annually. As Corporate Compliance officer for Presbyterian Villages, my job is to make sure that our procedures and practices are in compliance with all federal and state laws.

An important component of the corporate compliance program is our hotline where someone can report a concern or tip about a possible violation of our policies, procedures or any federal or state laws. Anyone may make a referral to the hotline. This may be done anonymously. The hotline is monitored daily during the week by me. You may also go to our website, <a href="www.pvm.org">www.pvm.org</a> and submit a referral. Either way, when I get the referral, I open an investigation. First I must establish that this is indeed a corporate compliance issue and not another issue. If it is another issue, I forward the concern to the right department. If indeed it is a corporate concern, I begin an investigation. After conducting a full investigation I issue a report to the Presbyterian Villages of Michigan Corporate Compliance committee including an action plan that shows the steps that have been taken to fix the issue. Is some cases my investigation shows that there was no violation. In all cases the investigation is conducted swiftly, confidentially and with integrity. If necessary violations are reported to the proper agencies for follow up.

If you have a corporate compliance concern, such as Quality of Care, billing practices, conflict of interest or any other compliance concern, please call the **HOTLINE at 1-866-964-6494.** Anyone, resident, family, vendor, or staff member can make a referral. Together we can keep Presbyterian Villages of Michigan an organization with the highest standards.
