

Mayor's Message By William Wild, Mayor, City of Westland



Greetings!

Once again, our All American City has received grant funds to help us continue providing you high quality services. Last month, City Council accepted a \$2.3 million FEMA SAFER grant to hire 13 additional professional firefighters for two years. The City was also awarded the Michigan State Police Byrne Justice Assistance Grant for an after-school tutoring and learning lab that will be located at the Jefferson Barns Community Vitality Center in historic Norwayne. This \$65,820 grant will create and staff a 16-student learning lab for tutoring K-12 at-risk children. The money will be used for technology and equipment, and to pay certified instructors to help tutor our children who are most in need.

On October 20, the City celebrated its first ever Ice Breaking, to celebrate improvements to the Mike Modano Ice Arena. Joining a large group of youth hockey players and figure skaters, City officials and other dignitaries along with Tracy Posey of the Westland Hockey Association, Julie Merchand of the ISI Figure Skating Club and Dave Petzel of the U.S. Figure Staking Club gathered to "break ice" on improvements to the Arena that include new and renovated locker rooms, additional community space and storage for the Arena Zamboni. Benefitting hundreds of Westland youth, these improvements will enhance the recreational opportunities the Arena provides and continues the City's reinvestment in our long term sustainability.

I'm also pleased to report that the long vacant Thomas Gist Academy on Annapolis was finally demolished with federal funding of about \$60,000 awarded to the City to remove this building that was not only an eyesore but also subject to squatters, several break-ins and metal scrapping. The Jefferson Barns Community Vitality Center was officially dedicated on October 16 when a large crowd gathered in one of the former elementary school hallways for the ceremonial ribbon-cutting. The Center will be home to the City's Community Development and Housing Departments, Nankin Transit, the Norwayne Boxing Gym, and the Wayne Metropolitan Community Action Agency. On hand were City and Wayne-Westland Community School officials along with many neighbors from the Norwayne neighborhood and volunteers who helped make the renovation of the former school possible

Mayor's Message Continued...

In addition to service delivery improvements, we continue to invest in the City's essential infrastructure. Examples include the repairs currently being made to the Henry Ruff Road bridge that we hope to conclude on November 25 and an ongoing project involving the Inkster Road sanitary sewer pumping station that is anticipated to be complete in spring 2016. As you may have heard, the City has partnered with Wayne County and Garden City to make needed repairs to Cherry Hill Road.

If you are not aware, Westland has partnered with Wayne County and Garden City for funding road repairs to Cherry Hill Road. We continue to invest in the City's infrastructure and are currently making repairs to the Henry Ruff Road bridge will be closed, barring unforeseen circumstances, until November 25. We have also begun work on our Inkster Road sanitary sewer pumping station that will impact the east berm of Inkster Road from Annapolis to Michigan Avenue; this project is expected to wrap up in the spring.

As a reminder, at 9:00 a.m. on November 10, I will host my monthly *Mornings with the Mayor* at City Hall. Join me over a cup of coffee and share your ideas or suggestions on how to improve our community.

With the holiday season just around the corner, I would like to share with you some festivities that I hope you will put on your calendar and join me in celebrating at this special time of year. Following Thanksgiving, Westland will host our Small Business Saturday on November 28. I hope you will find time to support our local retailers on this day that is so important to their economic sustainability and shop local. As you know in Westland you can find everything you want and everything you need for all those special people on your holiday gift list. At Westland Shopping Mall, there will be entertainment and opportunities to win prizes including coupons that may be redeemed at various Mall shops.

Our annual Tree Lighting Ceremony will kick- off here at City Hall at 5:30 p.m. on December 2, 2015. Joining us will be Santa and Mrs. Claus who will officially light the Westland tree and enjoy some cocoa and cookies as they meet with all the good boys and girls who live in our wonderful city.





November Recipe





1 (8 oz) package cream cheese, softened

 $\frac{1}{2}$ cup butter, softened

2 cups sugar, 4 large eggs, 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ cups cooked, mashed sweet potatoes

3 cups all-purpose flour, 2 teaspoons baking powder, 1 teaspoon baking soda

1/4 teaspoon salt, 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon or nutmeg

1 teaspoon vanilla extract

Directions

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Beat cream cheese and butter at medium speed with a heavy duty electric stand mixer until creamy. Gradually add sugar, beating unit light and fluffy. Add eggs, 1 at a time, beating just until yellow disappears. Add sweet potatoes, and beat well.
- 2. Stir together flour, next 3 ingredients, and if desired cinnamon in a medium bowl. Gradually add flour mixture to butter mixture, beating at low speed just until blended after each addition. Stir in vanilla. Spoon batter into a greased and floured 10 inch tube pan.
- 3. Bake at 350 for 1 hour and 5 minutes or until a long wooden pick inserted in center comes out clean. Cool in pan on a wire rack for 10 minutes. Remove from pan to wire rack, and cool completely (about 1 hour)

You can also use make this into sweet potato loaves using loaf pans.




