


### LOOK TO THE SKY

Solar Eclipse Monday April 8, 2024

A total solar eclipse occurs on average approximately every 18 months. The dark silhouette of the moon completely obscures the intensely bright light of the sun allowing the much fainter solar coronal to be visible. The upcoming total solar eclipse is set to take place on April 8, and it promises to be a major event. Here's what you need to know.

- 1. Path of totality: The eclipse will cut across much of the North America, including parts of Mexico and the continental U.S., and a small portion of eastern Canada. Sky watchers in 15 states within the U.S. will have the chance to witness the moon almost completely covering the sun, creating the effect of night in the sky. In other state, viewers will experience a partial solar eclipse, with the moon appearing to take a "bite" out the of sun.
- 2. Safely Precautions: Remember that looking directly at the sun during a solar eclipse can cause severe eye injury. Always use special eclipse glasses or pinhole projectors to safely view solar eclipse. Never view any part of the sun through binoculars, telescopes, or camera lenses without specific solar filters attached. During the few minutes of totality, when the moon fully blocks the sun, it is safe to look at the eclipse with the naked eye, but eclipse glasses should be used at all other times to protect your eyes.
- 3. Rare Opportunity: This eclipse is rare because it follows a slightly wider path over more populated areas of the continental U.S. compared to other recent total solar eclipse. Approximately 31.6 million people live within the roughly 100-mile-wide path of totality, and an additional 150 million people live within 200 miles of the path.

Join us on Monday, April 8th starting at 2:30 for the viewing of Solar Eclipse, in the community center parking lot. Solar Eclipse glasses will be provided to the first 20 people.


