# We are the Champions!

How do you spell dynasty? I am beginning to think it's W-E-S-T-L-A-N-D. On Friday, June  $23^{rd}$ , for the third straight year and fourth time in six years the Stars from the Village of Westland won the Village Victory Cup. When asked what the secret is to their winning ways, they replied it's "the 2 p's – practice and participation. We participate in every event with the maximum number of allowable participants and we begin practicing weeks in advance. We've found the more people, the more fun and the more you practice the better you get."

With 265 participants and 96 coaches from 17 communities supported by over 70 volunteers gathered at the Ford Community & Performing Arts Center in Dearborn, this year's Village Victory Cup was the largest one yet. It was also the loudest. Though we didn't have a decibel meter to confirm it, the noise from all the spirited cheering rivalled that of a jet engine. In the end, the Sharks from the Village of Redford were deemed the most spirited and were presented with this year's Spirit Award.

Not to be out done by their southeast Michigan peers, throughout June PVM Villages 100 miles or further from the PVM Home Office competed in the Virtual Village Victory Cup. Participating Villages competed in the games at their respective Villages and reported the results to the PVM Wellness Department, which compiled them to determine the winner. Eighty-eight residents from six communities participated making it, like its counterpart, the largest one to date. It was also the closest. By just a half point, the Hornets from the Village of Hampton Meadows emerged as the victors.



## **Service Coordinator Corner**

Welcome to another edition of the SC Corner. This month, the subjects are: Commodities, trips to Scooter's Malt Shoppe and South Haven, and the Secretary of State's appointment system and online services, and the Community Van.

**Commodities** – Senior Services will be doing an on-site inspection of the Commodities distribution on **August 2, 2017**. If you participate, please bring your ID that day. Also, any items that you don't want at that time cannot be left in the Community Room. Please take them to your apartment. This will make the inspection run more smoothly.

**Scooters Trip** –The Community Van trip to Scooter's Malt Shoppe in Scott's is on **August 16, 2017. The van will leave Sage Grove around 11am**. The sign-up sheet is by the mailboxes. Because we have a full van, we will be doing a car pool. That sheet is also posted. If you are driving your vehicle, please take yourself off of the van list. Scooter's menu is under the sign-up sheet.

South Haven – We are looking at another visit to South Haven in
September. Ralph has said that he can drive on a day besides Tuesday.
The tentative date is Friday September 8, 2017, leaving Sage Grove at
930am. Once the Scooter's trip is done, I will post the sign-up sheet for
South Haven.

**Secretary of State** – The Secretary of State's office has implemented systems to (we hope), make doing business with them quicker and simpler. You can call or text their branch offices to make an appointment. The number for the Stadium Drive location is 269-459-7922 or text "kalamazoo" to 513-685-9196. If you use any other locations, the information for them is available on the website (michigan.gov/mitimeline). You can use their kiosk (at the office) if you like to go in person. The Secretary of State also allows renewal of driver's licenses, State IDs, and plates. You can order a copy of a vehicle title and change your address online, too. I can help you to do this, if you would like.

**Community Van** – Metro is considering some changes to the Community Van service. Because of a very expensive (\$12,000) accident involving one of the vans, **they might require** agencies using the service to carry non-owner insurance on the vehicles. Any changes would take effect in January 2018. Paula and I are working on finding ways to keep Sage Grove in the program.
