On behalf of PVM Foundation, thank you again for all that you do to move the PVM Mission forward, and it is my pleasure to serve you as a resident.

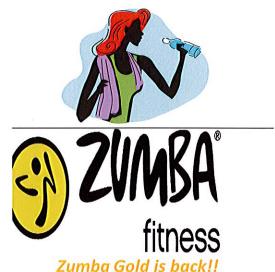

The AHA is making available to -FREE OF CHARGE-their new blood pressure education program targeted toward African Americans called Check. Change. Control. Their goal is to eliminate high blood pressure as a health disparity among African Americans. Unfortunately, high blood pressure in African Americans is the highest in the World.

Check. Change. Control is a Four month program that meets twice per month. During each meeting participants will have their blood pressure checked and logged, and will participate in a blood pressure related educational workshop on such topics as healthy eating, physical activity, stress management & more.

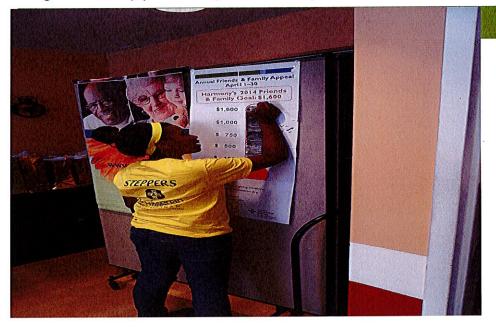
