A TIME OF GRATITUDE AND PRAISE

PSALM 7:17- "I will give thanks to the LORD because of his righteousness; I will sing the praises of the name of the LORD Most High"

The meaning of Thanksgiving has undergone many changes. Expressions of gratitude for survival, recognition of flourishing community, the defeat over the British, resulting in our nation's traditions and values. Over the centuries, families added their customs to the Thanksgiving celebration, preserving that which they held most precious.

To gather in unity – People come together in celebration of a common purpose for reconciliation of differences, a time of healing, sharing our victories and our struggles.

To teach the young – In stories retold, each generation brings purpose and significance to the richness of their heritage including memories and prayers of Thanksgiving.

To prepare the heart- In gratitude, we reflect upon all the gifts (family, friends, health) in our lives.

Meaning of Thanksgiving - Praise to God

In the Bible, the meaning of thanksgiving reflected adoration, sacrifice, praise, or an offering. Thanksgiving is an expression of gratefulness to God as an act of worship. "These things I remember as I pour out my soul; how I used to go with the multitude, leading the procession to the house of God, with shouts of joy and thanksgiving among the festive throng" ([Psalm 42:4](#)). Long before the colonists celebrated their successes, Nehemiah assembled two great choirs to give thanks for God's faithfulness in rebuilding the wall. "The Levites were sought out from where they lived and were brought to Jerusalem to celebrate joyfully with songs of thanksgiving and music" ([Nehemiah 12:27](#)).

The true meaning of Thanksgiving focuses upon relationship. Thanksgiving is a relationship between God and man. Upon their arrival at New Plymouth, the Pilgrims composed The Mayflower Compact, honoring God. Thanksgiving begins with acknowledging God as faithful, earnestly giving Him thanks, in advance, for His abundant blessings. In everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God" ([Philippians 4:6](#)). Thanksgiving is an attitude of the heart that reinforces an intimate relationship with God.

Resident Association Minutes-October 8, 2019 Meeting

The meeting was called to order at 1:35 p.m. The pledges to the American and Christian flags were led by Bob Healy. The new attendee was Donald Crampton. Frank Gitre gave the inspirational message.

Staff reports

David Miller-executive director

- Talked about preliminary design plans. \$28-30M project with 1 & 2 bedroom apartments (65% one, the rest two); 36 units with garages.
- Civil engineering plans were due the end of September.
- Architecture plans should be ready around 10-18.
- Financing is still in limbo, will probably get loan from Huntington.
- There will be some clearing between October and December.
- Cottage homes maybe next summer.
- Wellness Center 2020. Will be adjoined to Therapy Center. Outsiders will be charged a monthly fee. We have funds for this.
- Other stuff 2021.
- The main entrance will be just off 23 Mile Road.
- Pricing is uncertain, and there are temporary floor plans.
- There will be a retention pond instead of a fountain, which may be part of a new structure. A kind of run-off will get the flow out. It now goes into the Salt River. Most funding will be through tax-exempt bonds, which give investors a tax break.
- We will pray for good weather.
- Marguerite's will be closed through the end of the year except for special events.
 - ◊ More important when other structures open.
 - ◊ Open for Thanksgiving and Christmas.
- May get transportation for campus.

Brian – director of nutrition services

- There are other options besides the restaurant: the café, extra menus from the kitchen. There is a charge for delivery.
- Can have catering for small parties; must advise ahead of time.
- Omelets tomorrow as usual

Carolyn – administrator

- We gave away poo-pourri.
- Large units will pay more.
- The speed bumps are out.
- There will be flyers out for a luncheon and news concerning those who are unable to have open heart surgery (Nov. 6) and have aortic stenosis – a non-invasive procedure.
- Robo calls: try not to overdo these. We can opt out, but we will not get emergency calls or any other.

Scott Miller – environmental services

- We are repairing concrete.
- We will have the asphalt done soon.
- We will soon have the fall changeovers.
- Bob will clean the heating ducts at no charge.
- Donald will install new furnaces as needed for more efficiency, and can install “Ring” and programmable thermostats.
- Betsy said she needs a new doorbell because hers fell off.
- The speed bumps will be painted yellow.

Chris Gorde – fitness

- Classes re the same as last month.
- “Walk Michigan”: for every 20 minutes of walking we get credit for one mile.
- Thursday we will walk to the Custard shop. The full walk is 1.5 miles. We will get \$5 for a cone and one round of mini-golf.

Betsy Mianeki - activities

- Use the Suggestion Box.
- Saturday afternoon movie: Netflix changed the movie last Saturday. We will set up a DVD player. We need suggestions for movies: “Escanaba in the Moonlight” was made.


