Looks like March is going to start with unseasonably warm temperatures. I will be keeping my fingers crossed the warm weather continues to stick around for an early spring!

March 10th is the start of Daylight Saving Time, which begins at 2:00 A.M. that day, don't forget to "spring forward" and set the clocks one hour ahead, or you may find yourself an hour late to everything!

The March equinox occurs on Tuesday, March 19, 2024. In the Northern Hemisphere, this is known as the vernal, or spring, equinox and marks the start of the spring season.

March's full Moon, the Worm Moon, reaches peak illumination on the morning of Monday, March 25, 2024. Look for it on the evening of Sunday, March 24, as the moon rises above the horizon

What to do if you get Covid?

-Isolate for 5 days
-Mask for 5 days following isolation
-Call kitchen for delivery of soup (free)
-Inform our team
-Press pendant if you need The Med Team

If you receive Housekeeping or need non-emergency services we will resume service after your isolation period and when you feel well enough for us to assist.

We will mask in your home during the five days of masking and ask that you do the same while we are in your home.

Resident Chatter:

A brief review and update from last month's Resident Council Meeting

Treasurer Report: Two expenses were incurred in December Name Tags: \$41.97 and New roll of raffle tickets: \$13.77 for a total of -\$55.74. There was a total of \$60.90 in bottle returns resulting in an income of \$30.45 after the share of proceeds with Ron for assisting with the return of the cans. January balance was \$476.41. Please remember that returnable cans are collected on the second floor in the storage room.

- 1. Our Resident Council President, Juli, told of her 11 day hospital stay due to Covid and 2 strains of flu. Although this is a reminder, please be aware that Covid, Flu and other Respiratory viruses are still going around. It is suggested that all be conscious of washing hands and using the sanitizing foam located at the entrance to our elevators and near the mailboxes.
- 2. The 50/50 Raffle collected a total of \$96.00. The winner of the 50/50 Christmas Raffle was Mary T. and she donated a large part of her winnings to our adopted Christmas Family. The Resident Council's portion (\$48.00) was donated to our adopted Christmas Family as well.
- 3.VERY IMPORTANT: It was mentioned, that there are two machines that have been out of order since January. <u>Update: Service has been performed. Please report any additional issues to the office. Thank you!</u>
- 4. Reminder: Laundry Room Hours are now 7am-9pm Daily.

5. Additional Reminder: One of our outside activities has been a trip to the YMCA. At our February Resident Council Meeting, we had a glowing endorsement of the swimming pool and the many facilities available at the YMCA. "It's like being on vacation!"

Since we now have a PACE Bus available twice a week to take us to some of our various outside activities, don't forget to sign up. This is required in advance. If not enough residents are signed up for an activity, that trip may be cancelled.

The Activity Sign-up Notebook is on the table across from the Activity Room.

- 6. Reminder: Those who partake in the meals served here at Lake Huron Woods are invited to share compliments, concerns, a recipe or suggestion with the Chefs. Consider attending the monthly "Menu Chats" on the last Thursday of the month in the dining room at 1:30PM.
- 7. A concern, mentioned previously, discussed the "Heimlich Maneuver". It was mentioned by one of our residents, that the Fire Department has training available complete with a "dummie" to practice on.
- 8. Cappuccino/Lattes/Hot Chocolate Machine: Once again, the machines were filled, but depleted within a few hours. Again the recommendation of installing a motion activated camera was made. To go once a week or so to enjoy a cup of your favorite beverage is such a special treat. Please, respect this priviledge and respect others by sharing and not hogging. <u>Update: Consideration of Coffee Bar Hours is under review. Week days from 8AM-2PM. Please provide feedback at the next Resident Council Meeting.</u>

New Business

- 1. Overhead Lighting Fixtures in our apartments (update) have been replaced as a result of funding from DTE. It is another step in going "green" for the good of the planet. There was much concern among the residents about the lack of notice. Maybe there could have been some discussion of the possibility of change at one of the Community Meetings. Being well informed about change is always appreciated. Note: This was discussed at the previous Community Meeting. Based on the feedback provided the LHW team will be distributing

 Community Meeting Notes after the meeting to all residents. We hear you and agree more information is always a benefit.
- 2. Voting Updates: Mary T. Shared information about the new voting changes. There is Prepaid Postage on return absentee ballots. Voters do NOT have to apply for a ballot each time there is an election. Once the voter is registered on the absentee voter list, a ballot will be sent for each election until the voter moves or hasn't voted for 6 years. Also, there is now early walk-in voting for 9 days before each election. The Township building will be open during that 9 day period all 7 days per week from 8:30am-4:30pm. Early voting is 2/17-25. It is important that you vote before the Monday of the Tuesday election date. You cannot vote the Monday before the election day. This year election day is February 27th. The Township Hall for fort Gratiot is located at: 3720 Keewahdin Rd. Fort Gratiot, MI. It is very important that each eligible voter votes!
- 3.One last reminder to refrain from speaking while others are trying to speak or ask a question. Thank you!

In addition, The Med Team is now offering Home Healthcare and Hospice Services. These are both available to residents and to the surrounding area.



Fire Drill Tips

Lake Huron Woods holds multiple fire drills per year. Some will be announced and some are not. This is what to do if you hear or see the fire alarms.

- -Hang a brightly colored towel or blanket over your balcony rail or, for first floor, on the door of your patio. This will indicate to Fire Response team that you are in your home.
- -Close all doors and windows.
- -Shelter in place.
- -If directed to evacuate, meet at PACE building until given all clear.
- Participation in Fire Drills is Mandatory. Please make sure you are ready. Practice makes responding in the event of an actual emergency easier, as they say practice makes perfect.
- Consult emergency flyers for more tips. These are circulated throughout the year. If you need a copy see the office. Thank you!



One Call

Lake Huron Woods uses a system called One Call. This system allows the team at Lake Huron Woods to send messages with information that we wish to communicate to our residents.

These alerts can be set up for phone call, text and/or email. I know that some have reported issues with hearing the information via the automated speaker, so text or email may be a better option.

These calls can contain, but are not limited to, Activity information, Important Emergency Updates impacting LHW (Power Outage), Resident Council Reminders, Service Notices and much more.




