Here are some of the latest issues and what to do about them:

“Vee Eye See Tee Oh Are Why”* is that your Village’s battle cry? If you’re having a challenge deciphering the battle cry, try reading it again but this time read it out loud. So, is it your Village’s battle cry? Is your Village ready for this year’s Village Victory Cup?

Scheduled for Friday, June 23rd this year’s event is being held at the Ford Community and Performing Arts Center in Dearborn. At 11:00 am sharp, PVM Villages from across Southeast Michigan will gather together at this location to compete for the coveted Village Victory Cup travelling trophy. To ensure everyone has the energy they need to compete, lunch will be served from 11:15 – 11:45 am. The games themselves will begin promptly at noon.

If you’re not familiar with the Village Victory Cup, it consists of a series of competitive events that include a puzzle building competition, a walking race, a lip sync battle, a photo contest, a beanbag toss, a timed basketball shoot and more. You earn points for your Village by simply coming to the event and cheering them on. You earn more points if you compete in the events and you earn even more points if you finish first, second, or third in an event. At the end of the day, the Village that scores the most points wins. Service Coordinator Corner

Welcome to another edition of the SC Corner. This month, the subjects are: captioned phones, the Medicare Savings Program, the Presbyterian Villages of Michigan Benevolence Fund, and Commodities.

Captioned phones – I recently met a representative from a company that provides phones with speakerphone and captioning. The phone is free if you have internet service. If not, the one-time charge is \$40 for a veteran and \$75 for all others. There are resources to help you get internet and to pay the charge, if you don't have internet. If you would like to check out the phone, I have a sample in my office.

Medicare Savings Program changes – There are many programs, with different qualifications, in the Medicare Savings Program that you may be able to use. If you are interested in any of these options, please let me know. They are:

Qualified Medicare Beneficiary (coverage for Part A and Part B) with an income limit of \$1,025 per month for a single person)

Specified Low-Income Medicare Beneficiary (pays Part B monthly premium) with a limit of \$1,226 monthly for a single person

Qualifying Individual (pays Part B monthly premium). Income is \$1,377 per month of a single person.

Benevolence Fund changes – The Benevolence Fund is a resource through PVM that helps people with short-term financial needs. They provide up to \$300 per calendar year per resident, as long as you have lived in a PVM building for one year. Recently, their procedure has changed. They now require that applicants send a Thank You letter once the payment has been approved. If you have a need, please talk with me and we can get the process moving.

Commodities – The wait list for Commodities has been discontinued, so they can accept new applications. Their income limits have changed. If your renewal is due in May, please see me so that we can submit the paperwork to keep your Commodities coming.
