We would like to remind everyone that all complaints must be on a complaint form in order for the problem to be addressed. We will no longer take complaints over the phone or in person. Completing a complaint form insures that your complaint is received and handled by the correct person. If you need assistance in filling out the form, please let the office know.

VISITING PETS

It has come to our attention that several of our residents are pet sitting without notifying the office. According to VOW house rules: All pets must be registered with the office and abide by the Pet Rules established by Management. If a resident has a visitor who owns a pet or the resident is “pet sitting: for someone the following policy shall be enforced.

- Overnight visiting pets must be registered at the management office.
- Current pet policy and rules shall be given to the resident/guest with registering the pet.

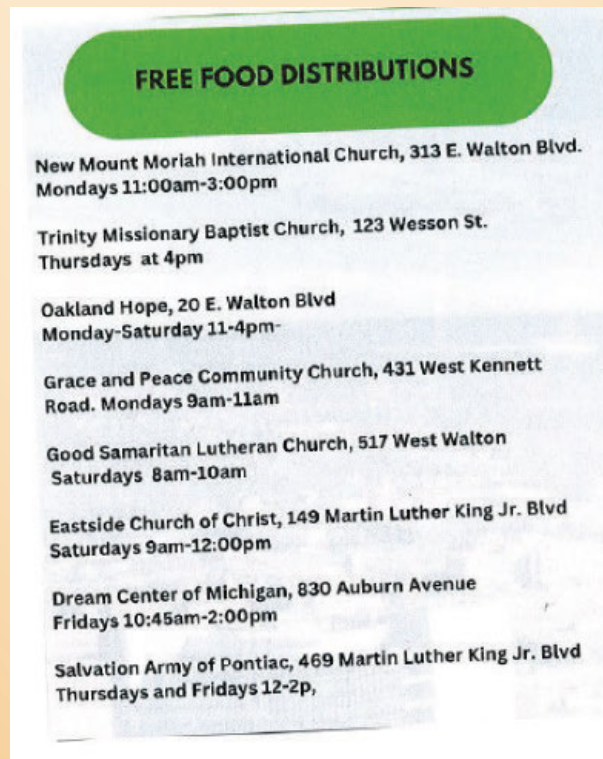

The Birthday party will be held on Thursday, June 27th @ 1:00pm. Join us in the Community Room for refreshments, bingo and prizes.

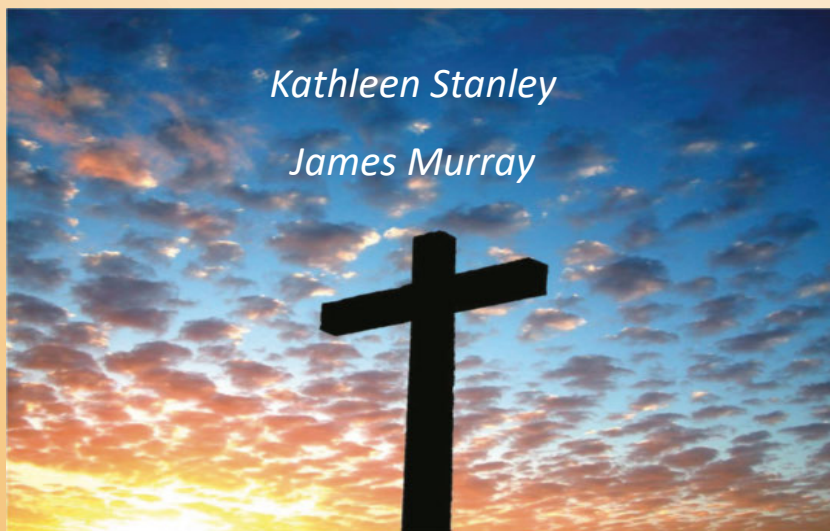
