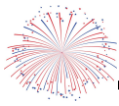

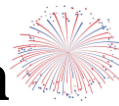

July Facts

The 7th month of the year brings us Independence Day and Canada Day.

In the Georgian calendar, the calendar that most of the world uses, July is the seventh month.

However, on the Roman calendar, it was actually the fifth month and was call Quintilis, which meant fifth. Later in 46 B.C., Caesar gave 31 days and the Roman Senates named the month Julius in honor of Caesar. In northern hemisphere, July is usually the hottest month of the year when it is actually a winter time in southern hemisphere. It gets very cold in Antarctica and cold and rainy in South America. Because there isn't much rain in July, the grass loses its greenness. Moreover, the abundance of flowers and insects occur in July.

1. The birthstone for July is the Ruby.
2. The zodiac signs for July are Cancer (June 21 - July 22) and Leo (July 23 - August 22)

11. On July 6, 1854, the Republican Party held its first state convention at Jackson, Michigan.
12. On July 11, 1804, during a duel between Aaron Burr and Alexander Hamilton, Hamilton was killed.
13. The 38th President of the United States, Gerald R. Ford, was born on July 1, 1913.
14. On July 16, 1790, District of Columbia was established.
15. The first atomic bomb was set off by scientists in Alamogordo, New Mexico on July 16, 1945.

Biography of Jeri Adrian

Jeri was born in Alpena, Michigan, in August, 1933, to Leona and C.P, Morton. Her mother and father both died in their early 90's. Her father was in World War I and her brother, Lyle, was in World War II.

Jeri met her husband in high school. Bill was two years ahead of Jeri in school and upon his graduation was called into his first career as a baseball catcher for the farm team of the Boston Red Sox. Then the Army found him and he was inducted after the New York Giants hired him. He did his service in Korea until his military father died and he was sent to France.

Jeri had been lucky enough to have a teacher in the 5th grade that heard the potential in her voice and started teaching her music which led to what she always wanted, a music career. She studied clarinet and oboe in high school, and continued her voice training with the Detroit Academy of Music after high school graduation. Her professor asked her if she wanted to audition with the WJR music department. She did and she was accepted. Singing with WJR was a wonderful experience and at the age of 84 she is still using her talent to the best of her ability.

Bill came home from France in 1954 and Jeri and Bill got married. He joined the police department in Alpena, where he then applied for the police department in Detroit. He retired from the Detroit police department as the head trainer of the motorcycle division.

Together, Jeri and Bill spent many years in property management, retiring in Howell in their mid-70s. Their two children, Bill and Julie, were very active in their lives. Julie spent some years putting herself through college to become the Human Resource person at Red Viking Engineering Firm. Bill was not blessed with good health and died at 59 with diabetes.

Jeri has been blessed with four grandchildren and three great-grandchildren with one more great-grandchild on the way! Jeri wanted to be closer to her family after her husband died and found Village of Westland. Moving here is one of the best things she's ever done!

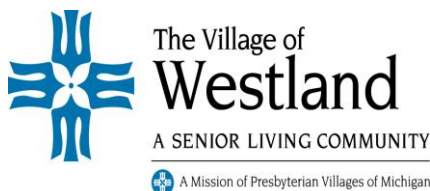
