NEW BUS!

After years of fundraising from the Family and Friends Campanian and Presbyterian Villages of Michigan Foundation, we now have our NEW BUS up and running! Here are some photos from the buses first week of outings!



Here is a reminder about the rules of the new bus!

- No food (unless packed for an event or groceries) or drink (with the expectation of water or groceries) is allowed on the bus.
- Seatbelts will remain fastened from the start of the trip to the end (when the driver will have you exit the vehicle).
- If you are in a wheelchair or scooter, you must transfer to a seat in the bus.
- If you are in a scooter, you must be under the weight limit of the lift with your weight and the scooter's weight combined.
- There is a maximum of two scooters on the bus at a time

Village of Westland (PVM) now accepts credit card payments. Please note – there is a service charge associated with the use of this type of payment.



No smoking is permitted on Presbyterian Village of Westland's property with the exception of the smoke shacks. The smoke shacks are located on the northwest and southeast sides of the main building that are connected to the coved parking.

Smoking in the apartments is forbidden. Residents violating this policy could be evicted.

We are the Champions!

How do you spell dynasty? I am beginning to think it's W-E-S-T-L-A-N-D. On Friday, June 23rd, for the third straight year and fourth time in six years the Stars from the Village of Westland won the Village Victory Cup. When asked what the secret is to their winning ways, they replied it's "the 2 p's – practice and participation. We participate in every event with the maximum number of allowable participants and we begin practicing weeks in advance. We've found the more people, the more fun and the more you practice the better you get." With 265 participants and 96 coaches from 17 communities supported by over 70 volunteers gathered at the Ford Community & Performing Arts Center in Dearborn, this year's Village Victory Cup was the largest one yet. It was also the loudest. Though we didn't have a decibel meter to confirm it, the noise from all the spirited cheering rivalled that of a jet engine. In the end, the Sharks from the Village of Redford were deemed the most spirited and were presented with this year's Spirit Award. Not to be out done by their southeast Michigan peers, throughout June PVM Villages 100 miles or further from the PVM Home Office competed in the Virtual Village Victory Cup. Participating Villages competed in the games at their respective Villages and reported the results to the PVM Wellness Department, which compiled them to determine the winner. Eighty-eight residents from six communities participated making it, like its counterpart, the largest one to date. It was also the closest. By just a half point, the Hornets from the Village of Hampton Meadows emerged as the victors.




The 8th month the year brings us National Aviation Day, and the last full month of the Summer.

<u>Biography of Catherine and Herman Williams</u> Written By: Motoko Huthwaite

Herman was born and raised in Clinton, Tennessee, 18 miles from Knoxville. He is 88 and will turn 89 on August 27th. Catherine is a native Detroiter. They first met at a Club for the Deaf when Catherine was 18 and Herman was 19. They fell in love and were married on October 20th, 1951 and had a lovely wedding.

They had three children, one girl and two boys but, sadly, their son Larry had an untimely early death. They loved all three children dearly. Only Randy and Nancy are still alive.

Herman worked for Ford Company for 44 years and retired in 1969. Catherine gave him a fantastic retirement party with about 90 guests. They had such a good time talking, dancing, and communicating through sign language, that while Catherine and Herman expected the party to last till 6 PM, the company stayed till 2:30 in the morning! Were the two of them tired! It took about three hours to clean up after the guests left.

Herman and Catherine moved to Farmington, MI, in 1961 and lived in that house for 55 years. Before they came here, Herman loved to go snowmobiling. He did so for 19 years. He loved to travel with his deaf friends, about 45 people, and drove them both to and from their destination. But Catherine didn't go with them because she has a disc problem with her back and it was too painful to go up and down in the lift.

They miss their old home, but are getting used to being here. Catherine loves the movies on Friday and Saturday nights here, especially when the large print captions are on. (Herman does not like movies.) Their daughter Nancy comes to see them regularly. A wonderful person and always helpful, she comes to see them often, at least once a week.

They already knew a new resident here, Loretta Milne. It was my joy to introduce them to Doris Woodman who, years ago, taught deaf preschool and kindergarten children. (One of the advantages of writing up the bios of our fellow residents.)

I often see Catherine at the weekend movies and in the Bistro for breakfast on Tuesday when the milkman comes. I am beginning to learn sign language from them. Now I can say "I love you," in sign language. Want me to teach you?

 Bus is available for residents to be driven to doctor appointments; must call the Activities Department <u>a week in advance</u> to make reservations, cost starts at \$15 and can go up based on mileage and waiting time over 1 hour.

If there is ever a charge for an outing, it will be written on the sign- up sheet. **Residents must sign up for all outings. Sign-up sheets are located in the mail room**


