# *This Month in History*

**August 3, 1492** - Christopher Columbus first set sail from Spain.

**August 31, 1997** - Princess Diana died at age 36.



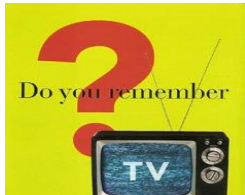
## ***HELPFUL COMMUNITY REMINDERS***

1. If you need to get into the kitchen, ask staff to open it or ask Betty in #239 or Diane in #111.
2. If you are admitted to a hospital, we request that you or a family member report it to the office. HUD allows you to keep your apartment for up to 180 days if you are in a hospital or rehab.
3. If you are going on vacation or will be gone from your apartment for more than a few days, let the office where you will be staying and how long you will be gone. You can be gone for up to sixty days.
4. If you wish to use the community room for a personal event, register the date with the office well in advance. We have a room use agreement to sign with a returnable deposit of \$20.
5. If you are worried about a neighbor, tell someone in the office and they will do a safety check. On the weekend, you can call the police if you are truly worried and they will do the safety check. It is not being nosy, it is being a good neighbor. Better safe than sorry.
6. If you something has upset you, please tell someone in the office. The incident may have been captured on camera so it is important to note the date and time. Do not wait; report it ASAP.

Lick it, bite it or use a straw to sip,

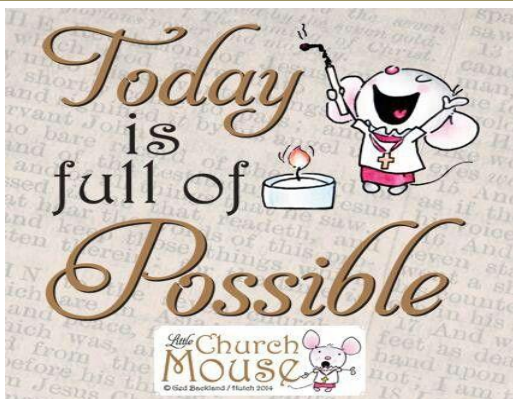
Banana Split...Or a double dip...

# Thank U FOR VISITING

We have many visitors to our building and visitors are always welcome. Here are a few rules they must follow while at Warren Glenn.

1. Visitors may bring pets into the building or on the grounds *after* registering the pet with the office.
2. Visitors are required to follow the same smoking rules as residents. No smoking in the building. Smoking is allowed only in the designated area at the north (back) entrance.
3. Children must be with an adult at all times and are not allowed to run in the halls.
4. Visitors must park in the visitors parking area unless they have a handicap permit.
5. There is NO PARKING near the front door. This area is for drop-off and pick-up only. Maximum standing time is 15 minutes.
6. Visitors cannot do their personal laundry in our laundry room.
7. Visitors cannot use our computers for their personal use. They may assist a resident with the computer



**Residents:** Any rule infraction or damage by a visitor is your responsibility and will be treated as if you broke the rule or caused the damage.

**Remember:** Please do not let anyone in the building unless you know for sure they should be let in. For example: the mailperson, Meals on Wheels volunteers, delivery people from UPS, etc. You should not let in family members of residents. They may not be welcome and you will not know this. They should be buzzed in by their relative who lives here.

Monday, August 27 – Bookmaking, 2:00 – 4:00 p.m.

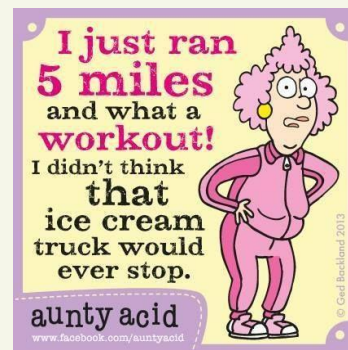
Then, we are going to the Detroit Institute of Arts on August 30 with the Village of Peace Manor.

It will be free and there will be plenty of time to rest along the way. If you have never been to the DIA, it is something to see. You don't want to miss it.



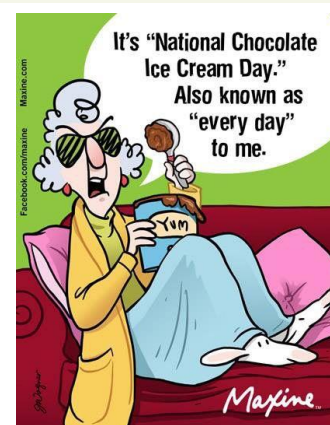

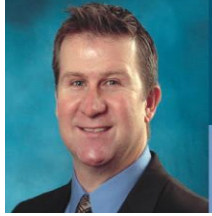
- Avoid peak periods of sun when the heat index is extreme.

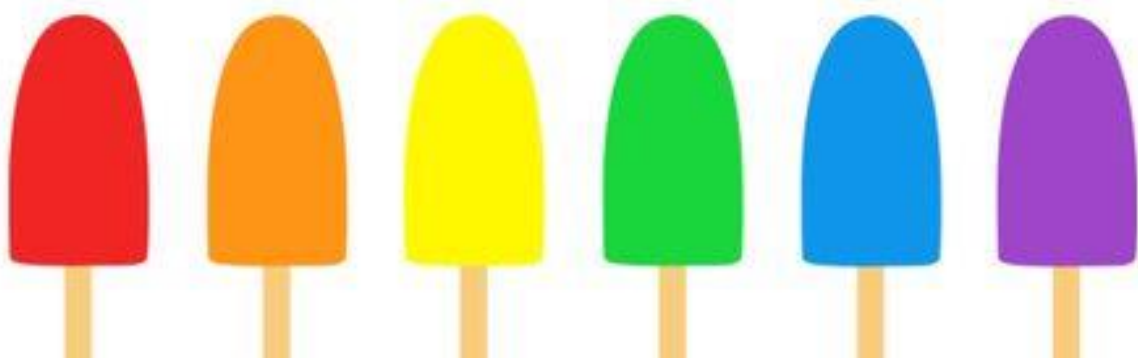
